<b>Removal Goods</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Rated original</b> Bill of Lading or A.W.B.</li> <li>• Packing list in English or Spanish.</li> <li>• Passport or copy of the passport certified by a lawyer</li> </ul>	<p>Partial tax exemption for Costa Rican citizens who have lived abroad a minimum of 24 months.</p> <p>Returning Costa Ricans wanting to apply for partial tax exemption, need to bring a certification from the Costa Rican consulate at the origin country, indicating number of years lived abroad.</p> <p>Other formalities for this status must be made in Costa Rica.</p>	<p>Customs clearance will take approximately 10 working days once shipment has arrived to the port.</p> <p>It is a requirement that the number of pieces and weight reported on the B/L matches with the real number of pieces and weight; otherwise, Customs will apply a fine of 250 USD and there will be a delay in Customs process from 4 to 6 weeks.</p> <p>A physical inspection (examen previo) of your cargo will be scheduled, to verify that there will be no differences between the quantities and weights declared in the shipping documents and the real ones. These tasks are done by our own personnel, highly qualified and with wide experience in the handling of your goods.</p>

<b>Fumigation of imported and exported wooden crates</b>	Costa Rica Government adopted ISPM-15 (International standards for Phytosanitary Measures Publication 15) Guidelines for Regulating Wood Packaging Material in International Trade (aka NIFM-15) to standardise the treatment of wood packing materials used for the transport of goods.	<p>Effective March 2006, any shipments into Costa Rica in wooden packaging (wooden boxes, Liftvans, cases, crates, pallets, trunks, barrels, drawers, wooden cuts), which were not treated as stipulated by IPPC with Methyl Bromide MB (the minimum temperature should not be less than 10°C and the minimum exposure time should not fall below 16 hours); or heated Treatment (HT at a temperature of 56°C for a minimum of 30 minutes) will not be allowed in Costa Rica and will be returned to the origin country under the shipper/origin Agent's expenses.</p> <p>In case insects or pests are found within the wood, Authorities will proceed to the destruction or incineration of the shipment. The inspection to conform with these Norms will be completed at the port entry.</p> <p>The wood packing material must be marked in a visible location on each article, on at least two opposite sides of the article with a legible and permanent mark in black ink. Labels and adhesives are not allowed.
